1. Character: The Detective Chief Inspector created by Ann Cleeves Author: The Indian novelist and poet, perhaps best known for 'A Suitable Boy'.






2. Character: Titular star of Dickens novel from 1850 novel. His great aunt is Betsey Trotwood.

Author: Dominican born author probably best known for her 1966 work 'Wide Sargasso Sea'.






4. Character: The elder sibling from Patrick De Witt's 2011 western novel.
Author: British-Turkish novelist, whose books include 'The Bastard of Istanbul' & '10 Minutes 38 Seconds in this Strange World'











